Benjamin Franklin Ladson was born on September 20, 1950 in Dillon, South Carolina. He was the son of the late Louise (Ladson) Jones. Benjamin resided most of his life in Paterson, NJ until moving to New York City.

Benjamin attended the Paterson Public School system. He attended Public School #25 and Eastside High School Paterson. He later attended the William Paterson. University Wayne, NJ. He was the first African American student to be elected as Class President and Counselor at Eastside High School. During Benjamin's employment and careers he was affiliated with the following organizations, Charter member of The Great PSI Kappa Nu Fraternity (The First Black Fraternity established at William Paterson University). He was a member of the Passaic County Democratic Party. A Past Board member of New Jersey Transit, as well as a Counselor in the Fairleigh Dickinson Upward Bound Program. Benjamin was a Past Board member of Paterson Task Force, the City of Paterson Dept. of Health and Human Services. He was a manager for the Paterson Housing Authority as well. He was a substitute teacher in the Newark Public School system and had been a Director of Totowa Branch of the Paterson Public Library. He was a Democratic County Committeeman for the Passaic County Board of Elections. Ben was also a former member of the Prophetic Church of God Paterson, and a current member of the Greater Calvary Church Harlem, NY where Rev. McKinney is the Pastor. He was a history buff who enjoyed debating many topics, especially politics.

Benjamin was very intelligent, cheerful, and an outgoing person, who loved eating out and enjoyed good meals. He loved New York City. He had a passion for taking photos of family and friends and giving legal

advice! His favorite saying was, "Man Up". His own words "Trusting in the Lord the worse situation can be overcome, keep your hand in God's hand, moving forward!!!"

Benjamin was predeceased by his mother, Louise (Ladson) Jones, adopted mother, Hattie May Ladson, wife, Michele Ladson, grandparents, Fullie and Dora (Ladson) Foster, sister, Dorenda L. Jones, two brothers, David Berk Jones, Jr., Mark Jones and cousin, Rosie Lee (Page) Stradford.
