**Irving Melvin Gaddy** was born on November 27, 1968 at Metropolitan Hospital, New York, NY. Irving was the second oldest child of the late Joseph Gaddy, Jr. and Sylvia Gaddy. Irving's father passed away on January 23, 2007.

Irving's childhood was challenging as he was speech and hearing impaired. Irving was capable of reading lips, he could communicate verbally, wore two hearing aides and was proficient in sign language. He spent the majority of his childhood away from loved ones to acquire his educational needs. He resided in Long Island, NY and received his educational services there until he was presented with his Diploma from Lake Grove High School in 1990.

He moved on to live in Rochester, NY and worked for the Rochester School for the Deaf. During his stay at Rochester, he still faced adversity in his adult years. Difficult years past and Irving finally settled in Spring Valley, NY where he was living an independent residential life until he became ill and was moved to Northern Manor in Nanuet, NY.

Irving had such a wonderful soul and an amazing smile. He adored his family immensely. When he hugged you; he held you tight so you knew he was showing his affection. When he was younger he used to try to teach his family sign language. The first sign he taught was "I love you".
