Obituary

On Friday, November 27, 2015 **Willie Chester Thornton** gently transitioned to his heavenly home.

Willie was born to the late Abraham and Amanda Barber Thornton on October 18, 1928, in Iron City, Georgia. He was raised and educated in the Seminole County Public School system. "Willie C.", as he was affectionately known, was an only child. However, his parents lovingly opened their home to several children of relatives.

After completing his education, he relocated to Newark, NJ. In 1951, feeling unfulfilled, he decided to join the military. While enlisted, he served in the Korean War and received an Honorable Discharge upon his separation from the military.

Willie returned home at a young age, and was married soon after. From this brief union, two children were born.

His deep Christian roots moved Willie to join Mt. Zion Baptist Church in Newark, NJ. While there, he sang in the choir, and performed other church duties. He served as a diligent member for several years.

One Sunday, Willie visited Mt. Olivet Baptist Church of Newark, NJ and felt drawn to join the church family. He stepped on board and began serving right away. He served in many capacities of the church including Chairman of the Deacon Board, and the Male Chorus. One Sunday, Willie was introduced to a lovely young visitor named Carolyn. They quickly fell in love and were soon married. To this union, which lasted just shy of fifty years, one child was born. Willie had also become a tractor trailer driver with the Kingsland Drum and Barrel Company of Newark, NJ. He remained employed there until his retirement in 1989.

By this time, Willie had moved his family, as well as his church home and ended up at Church of The New Covenant of East Orange, NJ. He served there faithfully until his health started to fail. Willie found tremendous joy here, and was even elected Commissioner Emeritus. He taught Adult Sunday School, served as an usher, and led Bible Study at a Senior Citizens Home. His genuine commitment to Christian living was infectious and Willie was eventually joined in membership by his mother, daughter and granddaughter.

Willie leaves to fondly cherish his memory: his loving wife, Carolyn; two sons, Harold and Willie Jr.; one daughter, Kechia; five granddaughters, Kiana, Sabrina, Theresa, Ashley and Carissa; two grandsons, Cantrell and Antwon; three sisters-in-law, Hilda Suggs, Thelma Little and Melverlene Suggs; one brother-in-law, Douglas Suggs; and a host of great grandchildren, other loving relatives and friends.
