Deacon David G. Revell was called home on December 3, 2015. Deacon Revell was born in Edenton, NC to the proud parents of Manison and Mozell Boyle Revell on October 1, 1927. He was the fifth oldest of eight siblings.

Deacon Revell was educated in North Carolina School system. He served in the US Air Force from 1946 - 1949.

After leaving the Air Force he met and married Margaret Riddick on Labor Day 1949 in which five siblings was born Margartann, David, Jr, Steve, John and Karen.
