<u>Reflections of Life</u>

James Lee Ricks was born on April 28, 1946 in Wakefield, Virginia. He was the 5th of 11 children born to the late Walter and Elsie Mae Ricks.

James received his formal education in the Waverly Public School System. He accepted Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior at an early age, and was baptized at the Liberty Baptist Church in Waverly, Virginia, where he attended regularly. He took after his father with his love of family and music.

James migrated to Paterson, New Jersey in 1963, and later moved to Passaic in 1964, where he stayed until 2010. He was employed as a Truck Driver for much of his life, working in New York's Garment District; I.H.E. Floors in Elmwood Park, New Jersey; Service Plumbing in Passaic, New Jersey; however, he was mostly known as a driver for Calling All Cars in Passaic. James Lee followed his heart and opened The Little James Hot Dog Truck, and J&R Grocery Store in Passaic.

It was in 1969, when he met the love of his life, Etta Hopson, and after a rather long courtship, they married on October 6, 1977. James later followed his passion for music and his love for quartet singing, he formed, founded and sang with his family in a group called "The Faithful Few". He then founded Virginia Music where he managed The Uplifters, with whom he got a chance to travel across the country singing and spreading the Gospel of the Lord.

James was a member of the Mount Moriah Baptist Church of Passaic, where he was the Bass Player, and he served faithfully for over 50 years until his health began to fail.

On Saturday, December 5, 2015, the Lord sent his angel of mercy to the Daughters of Miriam Rehabilitation Center of Clifton, NJ, and at 10:45pm James Lee Ricks closed his eyes on this side for the last time.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Walter and Elsie Mae Ricks; one brother, John Ricks; and three sisters, Bernice Young, Barbara King, and Diniah Ricks and brother-in-law, Frank Haskins; sister-in-law, Philip Jennings.
