Egbert Hall (known as Speedy) was born to Zippora Davis and Jethroz Hall in the District of Green Pond, Manchester, Jamaica, West Indies on February 19, 1940.

At the age of seven in 1947, Speedy attended Patrick Town All Age School. One of his teacher's was Mrs. McFarlane who was instrumental in his early education. At the age of fifteen he relocated to Kingston with his eldest sister Pearl Hall and there he started his manhood. At age eighteen he got a bicycle and he started to sell ice cream, fudge and popsicle. From this he was able to take care of himself and send money back to Manchester for his parents.

In 1964, Egbert met Hyacinth Booth (Known as Masie). The union produced six children; Ann-Marie Hall-Crawford, Millicent Hall, Gwendolyn Hall-Johnson, Michael Hall, Sharon Hall-McFarlane, Dean Hall. Egbert adopted Masie's first child Lorna Hall. Egbert had two more children Shaenell Hall and adopted daughter Cleopatra Jones.

Egbert later worked at KSAC in St. Catherine as a Garbage Collector for twenty years while working his private business selling ice cream and fudge. He was so favored and blessed that he later received a farm worker card to Canada and went back and forth for many years. He would later migrate to America to reside with his eldest daughter Ann-Marie Hall-Crawford.

In 2009, Egbert met Ms. Florence Jones and the flower bloomed and they got married on October 14, 2009.

He worked at the Bergen Regional Medical Center for six years where he had an outstanding performance. Egbert, "Speedy" was a very energetic person, full of humor, laughter and loved everyone. Bro. Hall got saved and became a member of Trinity Pentecostal Church of God in Paterson, NJ on July 4, 2010. He was a faithful member and enjoyed dancing in the spirit and worshiping his God.

He also enjoyed farming and was known in his neighborhood as a small farmer, planting calloo which he enjoyed with his bright smiles.

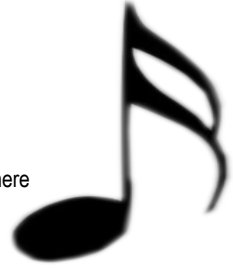
When The Roll Is Called Up Yonder
