In 1945, he joined the Army and was honorably discharged in 1947. He was proud to be one of the surviving World War II Veterans.

Leonard was employed by the Pendaflex Corporation, for twenty-eight years. He married Mary E. Hicks on December 20, 1975 and enjoyed their union until her passing.

Leonard was a faithful member of Union Baptist Church, Elizabeth, NJ and took great pride in serving as an usher.

A man of many talents, he was the family photographer, historian and a man of his word. Leonard was a news buff. He kept a detailed journal of his daily activities and enjoyed a Hershey bar (or two) each day.
