<u>Obituary</u>

Iredelle Dean Ward White was born in Abbeville, Alabama on June 24, 1913 to the late Willie and Deliah Ward. She was the fifteenth of sixteen children. On December 14, 2015, at the age of One Hundred and Two, God called Iredelle home to eternal rest, and eternal life.

At a young age, her family moved to the Vaux Hall section of Union, NJ. Iredelle attended and graduated from Union High School where she was a standout athlete in track and field and softball.

After her graduation, she met and soon thereafter married the late Howard E. White, Sr. They began to raise their family while living in Madison, NJ for many years, and later moving to The Oranges. It was there that Iredelle earned her certification as a Licensed Practical Nurse. She was employed as a Pediatric Nurse at Orange Memorial Hospital for 49 years. During her years in nursing, Iredelle was a member of several service organizations, including serving as President of the Maplewood Nursing Association, and many years of membership in The Licensed Practical Nurses Association of New Jersey. She also served for a time as President of that organization.

Following her retirement from nursing, Iredelle continued to serve as a valued volunteer at Orange Memorial Hospital and East Orange General Hospital. In addition, she tutored reading for many years at Jackson Academy Elementary School in East Orange, NJ. She was proud of her many years of involvement in The National Council of Negro Women, and was the recipient of several acknowledgements and awards from this organization. Iredelle also drew great satisfaction from her years of service as President, and later as

Trustee, of the East Orange Senior Citizen's Housing Association

A major part of Iredelle's life, and a source of great joy to her, revolved around her devoted service as a member of Union Baptist Church in Orange, NJ. During her more than 60 years of service at Union Baptist, Iredelle served as a member, and for a time as the President, of the Senior Choir, as well as participating in many of the Church's ministries and committees.

On June 24, 2014, her 101st birthday, Iredelle was honored by the City of Orange Township with a Proclamation celebrating her lifetime of dedicated and outstanding community service. Mayor Dwayne D. Warren of the City of Orange Township proclaimed June 24, 2014 "Iredelle White Day" in recognition of her stellar service, hard work and dedication, charitable spirit, and outstanding commitment to the City of Orange Township.

From her union with Howard E. White, Sr. were born four sons of whom Iredelle was very proud, and leaves to

cherish her memory: Dr. Howard E., Jr. (Delores), William "Bill" (Karen), Lorenzo "Lonnie" (Brenda), and Nelson Craig. In addition, Iredelle was the proud matriarch to her 11 grandchildren, 18 great grandchildren, and 22 greatgreat grandchildren. She also leaves to mourn a host
