Obituary

The world was blessed with **Francina Ann Neils** on March 7, 1943 in Georgetown, Guyana to the late Lionel Lampley and the late Eileen Erskine. Francina and her siblings, (Kent and the late Errol Erskine) were raised by her grandparents, Rosa Isabella Lampley and Ceril Lampley.

Francina grew up in Albouystown, Guyana and eventually moved to East Ruimveldt. She attended Brickdam Cathedral Catholic Church. After graduating Chattum High School, Francina attended Georgetown Hospital Training School for Nursing where she met her future husband, Clinton Neils. She completed her Register Nurse training in 1964.

In 1969, she moved to the Manhattan, New York and was married the same year. From this union, two children were born, Collette and Clinton Owen.

Francina earned her Bachelor's Degree in Public Health and Health Administration from St Joseph's College, and further earned her Master's Degree in Public Health from Hunter College.

Francina retired after 35 years of service for Montefiore Affiliation as head nurse of Med Surge Clinic, 2H and Supervisor at Home Care. She received many accolades including the NYC Mayor's Award and the Montefiore Presidents Award for her Research Studies in Breast Cancer Awareness with Minority Women.

Francina enjoyed doing community service through several organizations. She was a founding member of the Caribbean American Nurses Association for the Bronx, Manhattan and Westchester chapter, a member of the North Central Bronx Auxiliary Association, a member of the New York State Nurses Association and a member of St. Paul's Episcopal Shawl Ministry. In July 2011, in conjunction with the Caribbean American Nurses Association, she went on a Humanitarian Mission to Guyana, South America.

Around 2005, Francina became a member of St. Paul's Episcopal Church. She enjoyed hearing the word of God and her favorite scripture passage was 23rd Psalm.

Francina passed on December 25, 2015 on Christmas Day at the age of 72. She leaves behind: her daughter and son, Collette and Clinton Owen, daughter-in-law, Heidi, brothers, Kent and Melvin, sisters, Kathy and Betty, Aunt Elma, "Sister", Yvonne, beloved grandchildren, Christian, Annele and Leah and a host of other nieces, nephews, family and friends.
