Eunice Cornelius Clark was born on March 14,

1919 in Forsyth, Georgia to the late Bennie Benjamin, Sr. and Ethel White. Eunice attended the public school system in Atlanta, Georgia.

On September 29, 1937, she married Grady A. Clark and with this union one son, Richard L. Clark was born. The family moved to Roselle, New Jersey in December 1945.

She studied at the Charm School of Beauty Culture in Newark, New Jersey and graduated in June 1952. Eunice was employed by Sue's Beauty Shop in Elizabeth and gained such a successful following that she later became a self-employed Beautician. Upon retiring, she was a School Bus Driver for the Bergen Bus Company in Roselle, New Jersey.

Family was very important to Eunice. She was especially fond of children; they gave her such great joy. She was so loved that the children from the neighborhood referred her as "Grandma."

Eunice accepted Jesus Christ at an early age. She was a faithful member of the Bethlehem Missionary Baptist



Church in Roselle where she served as President of the Women's Day Committee, a member of the Senior Choir, the Transportation Ministry, Kitchen Aide, and was a faithful supporter of other auxiliaries until her health began to decline.

On Saturday, December 12, 2015, Eunice Cornelius Clark answered the Master's call at the age of ninety-six.

She was predeceased by her husband, Grady Clark in September 1987; siblings: Warren, Ben, James and Frank Benjamin, Grace Somner and Ruth Fullman.
