Doris Elizabeth Bassfield was born in Richmond, Virginia on February 8, 1942, the oldest of two siblings to Anna Bassfield. She was later raised by Annie Long during her formative years in Richmond. In her early years she was interested in becoming a nurse but later decided to become a teacher. Her passion for education was supported by individuals who recognized her drive and intelligence. She received a scholarship offer to go to college which supported her future career achievements. She obtained an Associates Degree from Kittrell College in Kittrell, NC and a Bachelor of Art's from St. Paul's College, Lawrenceville, VA.

Upon moving from Virginia to New Jersey she became a certified reading teacher and later a math specialist. While working full time for the Newark Board of Education and raising her family, she also received a Master of Arts from Kean University, Union, NJ. She taught for over 38 years in Newark Public School System. She retired in 2003 but remained active in education and with many other affiliations.

She was the founder of Martin Luther King Jr. Civic Club; a member of Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority; National Association of Colored Women's Club, Lions Club Secretary; United Women's federation Woman of the Year recipient; Newark Teacher's Union Retiree Chapter; Hillside Welfare Board; Hillside League of Woman Voter's; Essex County Retired Educator's; Montclair AARP and an active member of Franklin St. John's.

She is survived by her ex-husband, Elijah Nicholson; son, Michael Nicholson; daughter, Anita Nicholson; daughter-in-law, Sharon Nicholson; grandson, Solomon Nicholson; and granddaughter, Selah Nicholson; as well as a host of loving cousins, nieces, nephews, family members and friends.
