Within a few weeks in the program, it was evident that she had a unique ability to connect with people and a genuine desire to see everyone we served succeed. She worked relentlessly recruiting, retaining and providing services for the people she engaged.

After the MANO program terminated, Sheila led the outreach team in our then new demonstration project, testing and connecting transgender people to care. This project was highly successful and publicly acclaimed. Sheila was later transferred to the HIRE program where she connected people formerly incarcerated to care. While at Housing Works, Ms. Spivey, encouraged by her former supervisor, pursued further education and received a Bachelor's of Arts from the College of New Rochelle in 2010. Of this accomplishment, she was quite proud and ensured that a picture of her graduation was framed and prominently placed in her former supervisor's office. Most recently, Sheila worked in Community Partnerships, and was stationed at Cylar House. Sheila was one of the first three members of Community Partnerships when we started the program in October 2013.

Sheila was truly fearless. She had a deep passion for connecting clients to care and was a strong advocate for all. Underneath her bravado and brash talk was a very big heart. She pushed herself very hard to do more and be better. She was someone who truly lived Housing Works' values. We will miss her very much.

In addition to her parents, she leaves to mourn her passing, her partner of twenty-three years, Eric Acosta, they may have separated a few times, but they always found their way back to each other; her only sister, Gail Grant of Hartford, Connecticut, and seven brothers, Elwood Evans of Albany, Georgia, Earl Evans of Windsor, Connecticut, James Evans, Sr., and Daryl Evans both of Hartford, Connecticut, Kevin Evans of Albany, Georgia, Marcus Evans of Hartford, Connecticut, John Evans of Boynton Beach, Florida; and a host of nieces and nephews along with great nieces and nephews, aunts and uncles and a host of cousins, sisters-in-law and brothers-in-law and numerous friends.
