After High School Bevon worked at Simply Seafood with Smitty (his Step-Dad) in Englewood, NJ as a Prep Cook. Then the Cheesecake Factory, Clean Plate Company with his Aunt Chimere and another catering facility called Elan in Lodi. During the Christmas holidays, he worked for UPS and his last job was with Riviera Produce. Bevon's dream was to save enough of his money to buy his first car. On Jan 15th, 2016, he accomplished that dream. He was so proud and happy at the same time.
