

Shirley L. Mc Cloud was born on December 10, 1942 to the late Hollis G. (Dyke) Laysears and the late Stella Mc Cloud in Newark, New Jersey.

Shirley attended the Newark Public School System, graduating from South Side High School in June, 1960. She began working on the following Monday after graduation with the State Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control as a Stenographer. Shirley worked at the State ABC until she had her daughter, Antoinette, in 1963. She re-entered the workforce in 1964 as a Clerk with the Internal Revenue Service. In 1968, she transferred to the U. S. Department of Labor as a Claims Clerk. She held various positions and retired as a Senior Claims Examiner in December 1994. She was a member of the National Association of Retired Federal Employees and AARP.

She was a member and baptized at Mount Calvary Baptist Church in Newark in May, 1954. She later became a member of St. John Baptist Church in 2013, where she enjoyed being a member of the Women's Ministry.

Like her late brother, Edward (Buddy) Mc Cloud Jr., she too loved 50's and 60's "Oldies but Goodies" and also had an extensive collection of music which included rap. "Eminem" was her favorite because he was the only rapper that she could understand. ©




