

Sister Doris B. Daniels was called home to the Lord on January 28, 2016. She peacefully entered into eternal rest at home after a long illness, which she courageously endured with God's strength.

Doris was born the seventh and youngest child to the late Rev. N. Ward and Mary Rackard Bagley on November 22, 1925, in Leesburg, FL. Religious teaching, service, and education played an important role in her family throughout her childhood and adult life.

Doris graduated from the Lake County Public School system in Leesburg, and went on to earn a bachelor's degree in education from Bethune Cookman University. She also later obtained a master's degree in media from the University of South Florida. She served as an educator in high and middle schools in the Lake County Public school system for over forty years. She was also a school librarian and majorette coach.

During her career, Doris became the proud mother of three children from her first marriage to Clarence Bell: Juanda, Gregory and Glenn. She later married Rev. Richard Daniels. While maintaining her family, she continued to serve by singing in the choir, teaching Sunday School, and participating in various church auxiliaries and activities. She was also a Life Member and former President of the Central Florida Conference Missionary Society.

In 2011, she moved to Orange, NJ to be closer to her children. She still maintained membership at St. Stephen's AME Church in Leesburg, but became endeared with the church family of St. Matthew where she regularly attended and had her favorite seat.

Doris lived a long and fruitful life, and in addition to church, she enjoyed traveling, shopping, dining out, and special times with family and friends. All of her siblings have preceded her in death, but it was a delight for Doris and four of her siblings, who were also educators, to observe their same-time retirement in 1984 with a family celebration and commemoration in *Jet* magazine. More recent memorable occasions in 2015 were a family reunion in MD, and her surprise 90th birthday gathering in NJ. She was grateful that the Lord blessed her to be present at these and many other events.
