Obituary

Willie Ann Lattimore, daughter of the late Emma and Charlie Lattimore was born on July 24, 1940 in Boiling Springs, North Carolina. She departed this life on Thursday, January 28, 2016 at Newark Beth Israel Hospital in New Jersey after a long battle with heart disease at the age of seventy-five.

Willie Ann moved from Boiling Springs, NC to Newark, NJ in 1955. She graduated from Central High School located in Newark, NJ in 1958. Following high school, she went on to raise her three children, Dolores, James and Darlene. In 1976, she began her career as a receptionist at the Essex County Welfare Office. During this time she was an active member of the Essex County Labor Union CWA 1081 for Public Employees. She retired after twenty-six years on June 1, 2002.

Willie Ann always believed in having a close relationship with her family. She was the matriarch of her extension of the Lattimore family. As a true matriarch she was loving, kind and authoritative. She cared for her friends and family deeply. She was a great cook and best known for her one of a kind macaroni and cheese and homemade cakes. Willie Ann was preceded in death by her brother, Edgar Lattimore; her daughter, Dolores Lattimore; and longtime friend, Wallace Glenn.

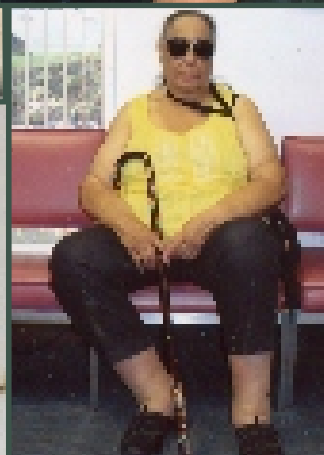
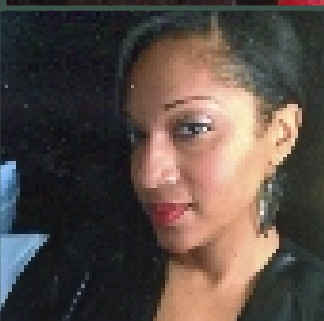

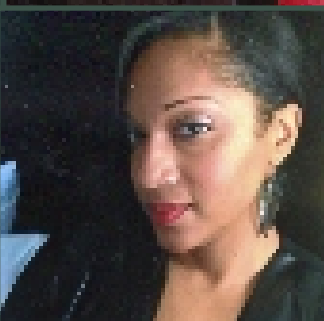
