## *Obituary*

Jerry enlisted in the United States Army in 1949 and earned the rank of Sargeant before being honorably discharged in July 1960. Jerry was also a Korean War veteran.

On the year of 2006 a Lodge celebration, Jerry met Sheril Perry and they fell in love. After a worldwind romance, they celebrated their love to the world with an extravagant wedding ceremony July 3, 2010. Their wedding party consisted of twenty0five supporting and loving family members and friends.
