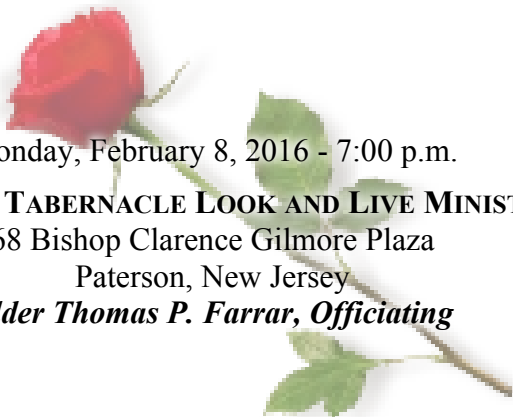

Reflections of Life

And she being with child cried... On June 21, 1942, God in His infinite wisdom, placed Curlyphine McDaniel into the loving care of Edith (Kennedy) and Eliger McDaniel of Lynchburg, South Carolina. God knew that Curlyphine would be showered with plenty of Love and affection. After careful prayers and fasting, Edith and Eliger decided to relocate their family to Paterson, NJ.

Faith without work... Curlyphine obtained her education through the Paterson Public School system. After finishing her studies Curlyphine began to help out her family by becoming responsible and secured employment. Many Employers were blessed to have her as an employee, such as Paterson Shade and Action Technology where she stayed until the company relocated.

Seek and ye shall find... After a brief time of unemployment Curlyphine was hired as a Temporary Employee with Calgon Corporation in Hawthorne, NJ which later merged with Merck. Curlyphine never obtained a drivers license but because of her ability to listen and learn, she was able to out drive some of her co-workers on the fork lift and other equipment. Several years later Merck relocated to Rahway, NJ and due to the long distance and the burden she felt was placed on her family, who drove from Paterson to Rahway at 1am, Curlyphine opted to retired from Merck and sought employment close to home.

Wait I say on the Lord... A short while later Curlyphine obtained a position at the Paterson Public School as a cafeteria worker. A position she took at heart. Serving the children had always been of passion of hers and due to that infectious smile, and loving heart, she was rapidly promoted to a cook and finally as a Cafeteria Manager. At each of her assignments the staff, students and parents

loved and respected Ms. Curly as she was affectionately known.

Take up your cross and follow me... Curlyphine took her faith in God to the heart. Beginning at 52 Clinton Street where her parents had become members under the leadership of the Late Bishop Clarence Gilmore and continued with the Ministry to its present location at 68 Haledon Ave under the leadership of the Late Rev. Dr. Allene Gilmore until presently under the direction of Eld. Thomas Farrar.

Go in my Vineyard and work... Curlyphine supported the Soprano section of the Tabernacle Choir...A diligent Usher...A devoted Sunday School Teacher in the Children Division... Smiled the visitors and members in as they entered the Church as a Greeter..Stripped and polish the Cafeteria floor, a gift she acquired from one of her previous jobs... Recited many poems and readings, "Go down Death", also performed in many skits in the Drama Ministry... Took care of the Pastor or his/her guests, or help raise funds to treat them out for an evening as a Pastor Aide... Received guests with goodwill and service with a smile as a Hospitality Worker... Crowned Kings and Queens during the Fuel Club Tea each year where she served as President. She was also President of the Culinary of the Church. She was a member of the IWC Interdenominational Women Conference Paterson.

Pray without Ceasing... The Late Mother Walker referred to Curlyphine as the "Praying Girl". During their last visit together her prayer partner reflected on how Curlyphine prayed before she left that day and after praying the scriptures came rolling off her tongue. Even as she laid in the Emergency Room she began to give God thanks and praise and was filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak with God in a language that only He and she understood.

And when the evening was come... On Saturday, January 30, 2016 Curlyphine opened her eyes for the last time, not

to see her daughter, mother, sisters or prayer partner but to look old Death in his eyes and there she “Feared Not”, because of her faith in God that she knew in a twinkling of an eye she would be In His presence.

I go to prepare a place for you... Curlyphine McDaniel rejoices in seeing her family who were anxiously awaiting her arrival; Her Father, Eliger McDaniel and Her Sisters, Marie Hayes, and Annette Witherspoon, Her Brothers-in-law, John T. Peay and Charles Huff, Sr. and countless Aunts, Uncles, cousins, niece.
