Keith L. Carter, the son of Joanne Carter and James H. Parson. He was born and raised in the Crown Heights neighborhood of Brooklyn, New York where he went from being a young boy to a young man upon graduating from Tilden High School.

Keith left his hometown to go down south to pursue his college education at HAMPTON UNIVERSITY. It was during this time while playing football that he got his nickname, "Big Kap". It was also during this time that he began to foster his love for music.

Upon his return to New York, he uncovered his passion and drive to become a "Disc Jockey". He realized his potential with his talent to mix and play music, and began to professionally pursue being a DJ as a full-fledged career. Keith was a member of various DJ groups such as, "The Flipsquad", "The Big Dog Pit Bulls", "Coast To Coast" and The Di's Coalition. He started creating a name for himself, he used his old college nickname as the brand for his career in music entertainment. Whenever he took the stage he was introduced as THE SURPEME BIGGA FIGGA DJ Big Kap. In the 90's, he got to headline some of the most legendary New York Hip Hop nightclub hotspots such as The Palladium, Esso's and the Holy Grail of New York Urban Nightlife, "THE TUNNEL", alongside his longtime friend the Iconic DJ Funk Master Flex. Their collaboration at The Tunnel nightclub garnered so much acclaim that the duo created and released an album together in 1999 appropriately titled "The Tunnel". Dj Big Kap also produced an all ladies anthem featuring Lauryn Hill entitled, "Da Ladies In Da House". As Big Kap's career took off, he further had the opportunity to tour all over the world with some of the greatest names in Hip-Hop such as The Notorious BIG, Nas, Lil Jon and The Wu Tang Clan to name a few. He got to be a guest late night DJ for HOT 97 and most recently landed the position as Program Director for Highly Unique Radio.

Keith L. Carter is survived by: his mother, Joanne Carter; his beautiful daughter, Mahogani Joanne Carter; his loving wife, Kennesha; his daughter's mother, LaVeinna; as well as a host of cousins, extended family, friends and his Yorkie dog, Harlem.
