Charles (a.k.a. Charlie) Baker was born on August 20, 1920 to the late Deaster and Alberta Baker in Vauxhall, New Jersey. He was the last surviving child of six children. He departed this life on Friday, February 5, 2016.

As a child growing up, Charles was baptized and attended the First Baptist Church in Vauxhall, where his father was a deacon and trustee and his mother a missionary and usher. As an adult, he was baptized "In the name of Jesus" at the Cornerstone Church of Christ in Jersey City, NJ under the leadership of the late Bishop Grady Dale, Sr. Later, he became a member of the Good Shepherd Church of Christ in Jersey City under the leadership of Bishop James Herron, Sr.

He met and then married the love of his life, Ethel Williams, on June 1, 1944 in Mountain Home, Idaho and from this union, seven beautiful children were born.

After graduating from high school, Charles enlisted with the Civilian Conservation Corps, a branch under the US Government Forestry Services, where he was the company clerk and canteen steward. While still in the CCC during 1942, he was drafted into the service of his country, where he served over 20 years. During this time he served in administration assignments with the US Air Force at various installations in the continental United States and the Alaskan Air Command, until July 1948, when he transferred from the Air Force to the Army. At that time he became a personnel administrative supervisor in the Overseas Replacement Branch at Camp Kilmer, NJ. After a tour of duty as Personnel Sergeant Major with the 24th Transportation Battalion in Germany from March 1950 to June 1953, he was assigned as classification and assignment supervisor at Fort Totten, NY and later as noncommissioned officer in charge of enlisted reserve personnel records at Headquarters New York Military District, where he remained until November 1957.

Sergeant Baker entered the Signal Corps pictorial field in November 1957, where he attended a television cameraman training course in the Army Pictorial Center. Subsequent to this training, he served at Fort Bragg, North Carolina and Fort Bliss, Texas as a television cameraman. In May 1960 he was assigned to the 12th Signal Battalion in Korea. Upon completion of his tour in Korea, he returned to the Army Pictorial Center in June 1961 with assignment with the Television Division where he performed duties as television cameraman and production supervisor until October 31, 1962.

After his discharge from the service, he went to work for the city of New York as a television cameraman and broadcast technician at Channel 31, WNYC-UHF. Later he went to work at Channel 9 WWOR-TV in construction and later as television cameraman and broadcast technician. He was also nominated for an Emmy for editing "The Franchise – The Tom Seaver Story". After 31 years in the television and broadcasting industry, he retired in May 1993.

Charles is predeceased by his wife, Ethel Baker; his children: Carl, Allen and Shelton; his parents: Deaster and Alberta Baker and his siblings: Elizabeth, Frank, Leasie, Timothy and Johnnie Mae.

Sergeant Baker leaves to cherish his precious memories: his children, Diane (Rev. Eugene) Byrd, Reginald (Hope) Baker, Gerald (Janet) Baker, Karen, Terrance (Wanda) McMoore and Kim (Wade) Chavis; 26 grandchildren, 33 great grandchildren and 2 great great grandchildren; Goddaughters, Cheryl Haynes and Yvonna Behlin and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, other relatives and friends and the Good Shepherd Church of Christ church family.

He fought a good fight; he finished his course; he kept his faith.


