In 1962 she immigrated to the United States and worked as a private home attendant. Sometime after, she became a licensed CNA. As a CNA she worked the better part of twenty-five years at Kings Terrace Nursing home in the Bronx. It was at Kings Terrace Nursing Home that Cynthia truly found her calling. She loved each and every one of the residents took care of. She poured her heart out to serve them well. She always counseled them to thank God for their life, count their many blessings (everyone had something to thank God for, she told them) and she never missed a chance to encourage them to be all that they could at that stage of their life. She always offered a hand to anyone needing help - residents and colleagues alike. At Kings Terrace she made life-long friends, some of whom are here today celebrating her life.

Cynthia retired from Kings Terrace in 1988 and moved to Cornwall, Orange County, New York. During retirement, she became active in the local seniors' club and enjoyed time spent with family and friends. For sure she became a doting grandmother to Matthew and Sara. She prayed that she would live to see both her grandchildren grow up and attend college. By the grace of God, this prayer was answered. Indeed, another blessing for which she was very happy and grateful.

After suffering a stroke, she became a resident at The Hebrew Home at Riverdale, in Riverdale, New York, in February 2009 until her death in February 2016.

Truly her last years the best. She came to know Jesus as her Lord and Savior and got baptized at the age of seventy-one at Times Square Church in New York City. Along with her daughter, Carol, she served in the Prison Ministry at Times Square Church. She was also in the Seniors Ministry there. In February 2012 she and Carol felt the Lord leading to know more about the Jewish roots of their faith and so started attending Sha'ar Adonai Congregation in New York City and also Beth Israel Worship Center in Wayne, New Jersey, two Messianic congregations. At both congregations she learned all the richness of the history of her faith and witnessed the "one new man" (Jew and Gentile coming together in Yeshua – the Hebrew name for Jesus) as described in the New Testament. She attended all three congregations on a regular basis and Yeshua truly became the chief joy of her life until He called her home to have eternal life in His awesome love, peace and joy.

Always having a heart to serve, she accompanied her daughter to feed the homeless and hungry at the pantry run by Mason Church in New York City. She derived immense joy serving in whatever way she could, even as she was wheelchair bound by this time.

She is survived by her son, Robert, daughter-in-law, Arlene, grandchildren, Matthew and Sara, daughter, Carol, cousins, many nieces, nephews, grandnieces, grandnephews, great grandnieces and great grandnephews.
