## Reflections of Rissie West

"I have made the journey home...rejoice for me; I am with my FATHER..."

**Rissie West**, completed the last mile of her journey on Wednesday, February, 17, 2016. Rissie was born September 18, 1927, the sixth of ten children to the late William Buggs and the late Ethel Smith in Wetumka, Alabama. She was educated in Wetumka, Alabama at the Mt. Canon Baptist Church School and reached the eighth grade before having to enter the work force to assist in providing for the family.

Like many southerners, Rissie was part of the "The Great Migration", she relocated from the rural South to New York City. Her first job in New York was as a live-in Nanny and care provider to a well-known movie star. After leaving domestic service, and moving to New Jersey, Rissie was employed as a laborer at Atlantic Rumple, Rahway Grill as a short order cook, Magnum Organ, and an assembly line worker at The Hershey Company in Rahway, New Jersey for ten years before retiring in the late 80's. Rissie held a number of jobs as she took great pride in her independence and willingness to help others.

Mr. Fred West of Rahway married Rissie Buggs in 1964 in his house which she made their home; where he embraced step daughter, Vanessa and adored her as his very own, and their beloved dog Jip. Rissie made sure to let Fred know it was a package deal...."All 3 of us or nothing!"

Rissie joined Second Baptist Church in Rahway, New Jersey, where she has been a FAITHFUL and DEVOUT member for more than fifty-one years. She proudly served on the Senior Missionary Society and 100 Women in White Choir. In her youthful years, you could count on her caring for the sick, cooking, washing or doing whatever task needed attention.

Rissie was spirited, strong willed and a generous woman; that gave of herself willingly to help family and friends in times of need and support. She was a woman of substance, a NUTURER who lived her life with dignity and great pride. Highly favored and fiercely of FAITH her walk with GOD was daily and her acts and treatment of others reflected as much.
