Doris worked at North Presbyterian Head Start over twenty years. In the early years she went from volunteer to dietician. Doris's passion and love for children and cooking made her an advocate for all parents who have young children to give them their first experience in attending a head start program.

Doris was an excellent cook. Everyone was always welcomed to come to her home for a hot meal because she started and ended her day in the kitchen. Even when her health started to decline she was still able to cook a full course meal for all of her family events.
