Obituary

Addie Stewart was born on August 2, 1921 to Leroy and Lossie Mae Williams in Monroe, North Carolina. She departed this life on Sunday, February 21, 2016 at St. Mary's Nursing Home in Orange, New Jersey.

Growing up in Monroe, she attended the Winchester Avenue School and was a member of Union Springs A.M.E. Zion Church.

As a young woman, she married Edkar Gullede. To this union were born two daughters, Janie Mae Gullede and Bettie Joe Gullede. They later separated and, in the late 1940's, Addie moved to Montclair, New Jersey where she was a domestic worker in the home of Lawrence Barney, then-president of Hoffmann-La Roche.
