Life Reflections

Jesse Robert Joubert was born on February 10, 1930 in Washington, Louisiana, son of the late Wardy Joubert and Clara Lock Joubert. Growing up in a Christian home, Jesse accepted Jesus Christ as his savior at a young age where the family attended St. Peter's Baptist Church.

Jesse played basketball throughout his high school years in Washington, Louisiana. He continued his education at Southern University and during his junior year, he received a scholarship for basketball. He graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree in Physical Education and ROTC Certification. He also attended Fairleigh Dickinson University where he was studying for his Master's degree.

After college, he enlisted in the United States Armed Forces, serving 20 years of service. In the Army, Jesse graduated from flight and helicopter schools. He served two tours of duty in Vietnam, and Korea as a Helicopter Pilot, and one tour in Japan and Germany. Jesse retired from the Army as a Major in August 1972.

He was employed as a Logistics Manager for Paul's Trucking Company in Avenel for 17 years, retiring in 1989. Previously, he worked at Supermarket General for 2 years.

Jesse was a lifelong member of National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) in Roselle and Kappa Alpha Psi fraternity.

A dedicated member of St. Elizabeth's Episcopal Church in Elizabeth for many years, Jesse served on the Standing Committee of the Episcopal Archdiocese of Trenton, as well as the Vestry, and Warden of the Church.

On Sunday, February 21, 2016, Jesse Robert Joubert departed this life at Raritan Bay Medical Center in Old Bridge, New Jersey at the age of 86.

He was predeceased by his three siblings, and his daughter.

Jesse leaves to cherish his precious memory, his devoted wife of 59 years, Melissa R. Joubert; children; grandchildren; great-grandchildren; nieces, nephews, cousins, and a host of dear relatives and friends.

Jesse was brave, courageous, fair, honest and deeply devoted to God and his family.
