Harry Morris a.k.a "Hippy" Page was the first child born to the late Diannah Holmes-Paige and George Paige, Sr. He was born on October 11, 1919 in Coffin Point, South Carolina. Coffin Point is a community located on St Helena Island on the outskirts of Beaufort, South Carolina. Harry was the oldest of seven children and the last of his siblings to be called to eternal rest. He departed this life on Tuesday, March 1, 2016 after living a long abundant life.

At the age of nine he moved to Savannah, GA, and resided there until he enlisted in the US Army during World War II in 1941. In 1945, he received an honorable discharge as a corporal in the state of California. In 1947, two weeks after meeting Augusta Ann (Gussie) Mann. They were married on July 19, 1947, in Ridgeland, South Carolina. They shared many blissful years together until her demise on May 21, 1985.

He later moved north to the Bronx, New York in 1947. He then later moved to Passaic, New Jersey 1965. Finally, in May of 1966, he relocated to the city of Paterson, New Jersey where he became a long time resident. He worked for Ace Wire Company (Universal Wire) Paterson, NJ. He became employed by the Fairlawn Bus Company Fairlawn, NJ for eight years. He was also employed by Wagner Tours Bus Company Haledon, NJ where he worked as a maintenance worker for many years until he retired at the age of 65. He continued to reside in Paterson, and was a resident of the Riverview Towers for almost 51 years. He was one of the longest living tenants to reside there.

In addition, Harry was a humble servant of the Lord. He rededicated his life to the Lord on May 30, 2014 at the Mount Bethel Baptist Church Ridgewood. God blessed him with the opportunity to cast his vote and witness the election of our first African-American President of the United States of America, Barack Obama.

Harry was a man who loved life, loved to travel, and most importantly he loved people. He was highly and greatly respected in the community by all who knew him, young or old. On any given day you may catch him either going or coming from a Mets game at Shea stadium, his weekly bus rides to Atlantic City, sitting in the park or just taking a daily stroll throughout the city of Paterson.
