Obituary of Ernest Scotland Dade

Ernest Scotland Dade, know to family and friends as “Scotty,” died on Monday, March 21, 2016 in Newton, NJ. He was born November 14, 1933 in Montclair, NJ the second of five children to Ward A. Dade Sr. and Catherine E. (Harris) Dade.
