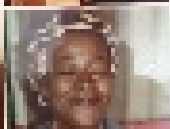
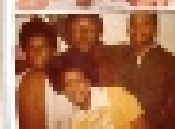
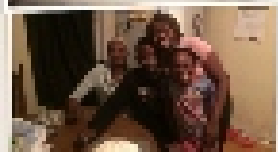
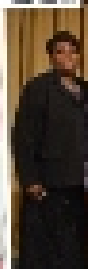
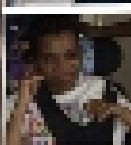
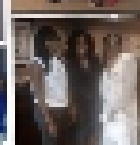
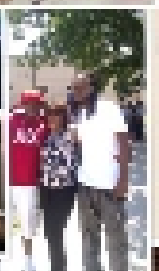
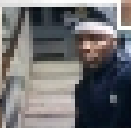
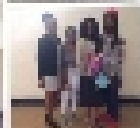
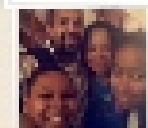
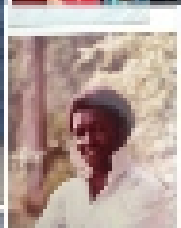
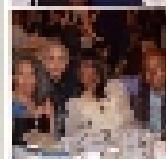
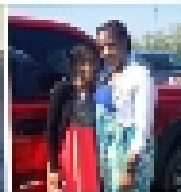
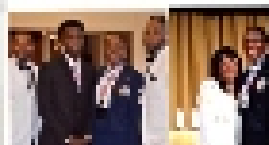
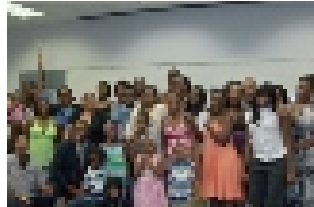
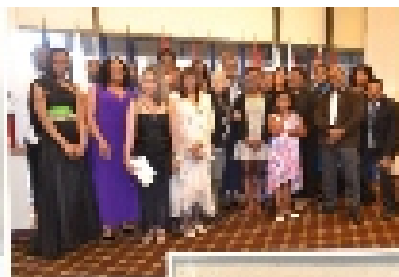
Shirley Rose Flagg was born to the late TC Mitchell and Hattie Mae Mitchell on February 2, 1940.
