## <u>Obituary</u>

**William Emerson Blair Jones** was born in Newark, New Jersey, on March 11, 1927. Shortly after this birth, William was brought home with his mother, Dorothy Ella Jones.

William attended Public School 14 and then left to attend Snyder High School. He was a good student and was interested in sports such as football, he and his friends played in the neighborhood and after school William had chores at home. During his young school years, he gained two half sisters of which one is now deceased.

He attended Salem Baptist Church Sunday School, as well as regular church services on Sundays.

He had a close bond with his grandparents, Sam and Mary Nelson. He lost his grandfather when he was quite young. His grandmother survived until William reached his teen years. During William's teen years, it was at this time, he left high school to join the Merchant Marines. He was part of the unit for many years of which he traveled all around the globe working on the boats and seeing the world - a true education. Upon ending his career with the Merchant Marines, he returned to Jersey City and acquired different jobs until a friend of his told him of an opening at Western Union Telegraph of New York. In the early 1960's, he worked at Western Union as a wireman/filing of the tele-type machines and other duties for twenty-five years.

During the 1960's, he met and married a lady from Harlem-originally from Selma, Alabama, and her name was Jewell Martin. They married in 1962. William and Jewell (Penny) had a good life. William was a step-father to Penny's daughter, Rosalind. William worked Mondays - Fridays at Western Union and had an interesting time playing the Bass Fiddle in his spare time. He played the Bass Fiddle at many Jazz venues and in the Metropolitan areas. He retired from his job at Western Union in 1984 and then devoted his life to playing the music he loved - Jazz.

In the late 1980's, he lost his wife, Jewell (Penny) and then in the early 1990's he lost his step-daughter. But he picked himself up and continued playing until the end of 2013.

William was in and out of the hospital from 2014-2015. On January 3, 2016, he entered the VA Hospital. He was there for 20 days. On January 28, 2016, his doctor suggested that he be put in a Healthcare and Rehabilitation Center to help him get stronger. William passed away April 5, 2016.
