

Reflections of Life

Bertha Hicks Brown, the daughter of the late Rev. Frank and Amzie Worthy Hicks, was born on November 18, 1930 in Berkeley Township, So. Toms River, NJ. She attended Berkeley Township Schools and completed her education at the Manual Training Industrial School (MTIS), known as "Tuskegee of the North" in Bordentown, NJ. She married William O. Pendleton, Sr. in 1947, and of that union were born William, Jr. and Katrina.

She attended Friendship A.M.E. Church under the leadership of her father, the late Rev. Frank Hicks (founder and pastor). She later joined Wells Chapel A.M.E. Church in So. Toms River. She later became a member of Second Baptist Church of Toms River, where she worked diligently with Vacation Bible School with the pre-school class and as registrar. It was during her fellowship at Second Baptist that she attended Monmouth Bible Institute in Farmingdale, NJ, proudly graduating with honors, after four years of study!

Bertha's employment just prior to her retirement was at Ciba Geigy Chemical Plant in Toms River, NJ, where she worked as a maintenance technician. For many years Bertha was the "Nanny" to many children, including caring for the children of the owners/operators of Howard Johnson Hotel and Restaurant, Toms River, NJ, where she was employed for many years. She became the live-in nanny for the owner of Gateway Toyota, Toms River, caring for their child for several years, just to name a few. Bertha became the guardian of her sister's (Alfreda) children, the late Oscar, Jr., Phillip, Nadine, and Russell, after her sister's untimely death. Bertha loved her family dearly and put no one before them.

Her son, William O. Pendleton, Jr. predeceased her in 1984. She was also predeceased by her siblings: James Hicks, Clara Lee, Russell Hicks, Essie Clay, Ruth Lee, Loretta Price, Noel Hicks, Alfred Hicks, and Alfreda Smalls.
