After migrating to New York City, her sons, James Edward and Harold Richard were born. Her love for family was boundless. Lucy's empathetic spirit and desire to give of herself unselfishly, when others were in need, led to the blessed adoption of Dannie Wayne Dawson, who she raised as her own with her biological children.
