

## <u>Obítuary</u>

**CYNTHIA B. ROBERTS**, affectionately called "NANA" was born in East Orange, NJ, the older of two children, Helena B. Smith (deceased) born from the union of Annie May Berry Bryant and William Cullen Bryant (both deceased). Cynthia's father was the first African American grocer in East Orange. Cynthia departed this life peacefully, at the age of 100 on May 8, 2016 at the Summit Ridge Center in West Orange.

In 1930, Cynthia graduated from Ashland School, East Orange and four years later she graduated with honors from East Orange High School. At age twelve, she was an Urban League youth member who participated in a "sit in" which integrated the then segregated Schrafft's Restaurant in Newark, NJ.

Cynthia married Albert E. Roberts of Orange, NJ (deceased) in 1935 and raised three wonderful children: the late Ann H. Culver, the late Albert E. Roberts, Jr. both of East Orange and Judith S. Barrett of Flanders, NJ.

Cynthia and her family joined St. James AME Church in 1948 and she was appointed Sunday School Superintendent in 1951 and served twenty-nine years. She was also a charter member and past president of the Pride of St. James and a member of the Precious Gems

Throughout her career, she managed three locations of the Taft/Windsor Cleaners and volunteered her at various senior centers and nursing homes sharing her expertise as a Mary Kay Beauty Consultant. As many of you know, Cynthia believed she was not fully dressed without her makeup.

Cynthia was a charter member of the Ashland School PTA in East Orange and served as Vice President from 1952-1953 and President from 1953-1955. She was a member of the East Orange Historical Society and the Essex County Audubon Society plus she was a member of the Brookside Senior Housing Tenants Association and President of the Brookside Social Club for many years where she resided prior to entering Summit Ridge.

In 1994, Cynthia was honored by Stockton Kentopp School, Gordon Parks Academy and Columbia School for speaking at their grandparent's Mentorship programs. She was Past Worthy Matron and Past Grand Financial Secretary of the Harriet Tubman Grand Chapter of the order of Eastern Stars.

In honor of Cynthia's 100<sup>th</sup> birthday, President Barack Obama and First Lady Michelle Obama sent her a congratulatory letter and Lester E. Taylor III, Mayor of E.O. honored her with a proclamation of the city.

Cynthia's strong faith, love of God, and that of her family and friends, is the blessing she attributed for sustaining her well into her golden years.

She leaves to cherish fond memories: her daughter, Judith Barrett (James), her grandchildren, Elaine Culver, Terry Thompson (Van), Trent L. Barrett (Charmaine); great grandchildren, Ryan and Chad Culver (Alexandria), Tia and Tory Thompson, Chantiona Smith, Trent A., Laila and Trey Barrett; great great grandchildren, Kai, Heru and Atlas Culver and Griggs and Berry Family and a host of nieces, nephews, relatives and friends.
