Obituary

Luevenia D. Hines, affectionately known as Lue, was the only child born to Elizabeth and Ansil Days on August 13, 1934 in Columbia, South Carolina. In her early years, Luevenia's mother migrated north to New Jersey; during this time she lived with her grandparents Jerry and Lizzie Weeks along with her cousins; Emma Heron, Gertrude Henderson, Earnest Brown, Edward Brown, James Brown, and John Curtis Brown. They were a very close knit family.

It was not long before Luevenia moved to Elizabeth, New Jersey with her mother in 1948 where she attended Elementary School #2, and then attended Lafayette Middle School where she met her long-time friend, Shirley Wilkins Way. In 1953, after they graduated from Battan High School, Lue continued her education in the field of Radiology before beginning her career at Martland Medical Center in Newark, N.J. It was not long before Lue advanced to Staff Supervisor of x-ray technicians at United Hospital in Newark, NJ until her retirement in 2003.

As a member of New Zion Baptist Church since 1954, Luevenia loved her church and was very active in serving the community and never hesitated to share her opinion. She was lovingly known as Momma Lue to all of her neighbors and her children's friends. She served on the Usher Board for many years and always volunteered to help in the kitchen. Luevenia loved to cook for her family and friends always experimenting to make a new dish or mixing different spices for a unique taste. She was well-known for her famous string beans and leg of lamb. At any given moment she would call to say, "Come get a plate", or she was happy to bring it to you. She also enjoyed helping Shirley who catered professionally.

Family was important to Lue. She was determined to keep in touch with all of them constantly calling and checking on them. Her home was always open to them.

Lue was preceded in death by her mother Elizabeth Weeks Brinkley, and her father Ansil Days, stepfathers, William Brinkley and James (Pop) Melvin, first husband Howard Wyatt, son, Lavarra Melvin Hines, and granddaughter, Candice Monique Lee.
