Obituary

Deacon Sebert Roy Anglin peacefully entered into eternal rest on Monday, May 9, 2016 at Newark Beth Israel Medical Center following a long illness. Sebert was born to Susan McCloud and Jonathan Anglin in Coffee Piece, Clarendon, Jamaica W.I. on October 10, 1942.

In his early years, Sebert worked as a Farmer and traveled to the United States on Farm Work. He was devoted to his mom as he became her rock during her long illness. As his mom's illness progressed Sebert was seen taking his mom on his back to her doctor's visit. After the death of his mother, he migrated to the United States in pursuit of a better life, where he worked on the Tomato Farm. Mr. Anglin wore many other hats such as a janitor, Mason, custodian for Hoffman Laroche, a Super for Roy Allen and as he moved through life desiring to make the pathway more comfortable for his family. He met his wife, Vivienne in East Orange at church on March 23, 1985, and they were married in 1989 at The Salvation Army in East Orange. He accepted Jesus Christ as his personal Savior in 1987 and was ordained as a Deacon on August 25, 2007 at New Vision Zion Worship Center, Inc. On May 12, 2013, he became a member at Faith Gospel Tabernacle.

Mr. Anglin was not satisfied with the level of education he enrolled in "Literacy Volunteer of America Essex/Passaic County" where he was honored a Student of the Year Award, in 2008. Mr. Anglin was an advocate for education, this he instilled in his children and grandchildren.

Mr. Anglin was not only a devoted husband; but an honorable father as well. His children and grandchildren looked up to him as a man with great morals, strong work ethics and a willingness to sacrifice. He was known as the best handyman in town, if Sebert could not fix it that means it was unfixable.

Deacon Anglin leaves behind: his wife of twenty-six years, Vivienne; three sons, Wayne, Kenroy and Aldin; four daughters, Evelyn, Sharon, Diana and Andrea; eighteen grandchildren; and sister-in-law, Erna Allen. He is also survived by his beloved sister, nieces, nephews and a host of relatives and friends.
