John Henry Julius, Sr., affectionately known as "Daddy Rap," was born on November 22, 1931 in Lee County, South Carolina, the son of the late Eugene and Lucille Julius. As a youth, John found the Lord and became a member of Mount Olive AME Church in Woodrow, South Carolina. John reunited with the Lord when he became a member of First Baptist Church in Linden, New Jersey.

Looking for a better life, Daddy Rap relocated his young family to East Grand Street in Elizabeth, New Jersey in 1965. He worked as a long distance Truck Driver prior to this move. He worked at the General Gummed Corporation in Linden and The Wing Company in Cranford, New Jersey. He was employed as a Custodian at St. John Vianney Church School in Colonia, retiring in 1996.
