On Monday, May 30th, 2016, a spirited soul, **Elizabeth McAlister** left her family to be with her Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Elizabeth was born in Allendale, South Carolina on March 15, 1925. She was the third child of the late Issac and Birdie (Davis) McDuffie. Scarlet Fever claimed her hearing and auditory abilities but did not stop her from exploring all that life had to offer. Seeking a better educational opportunity for Elizabeth, her mother moved the family to the north. Philadelphia is the place they settled and where Elizabeth would grow up to be a fiercely independent woman.

Growing up, her family attended Union AME Church. She went to a school for the deaf where she studied hard and developed lifelong friends. It was through these friends and the Philadelphia Black Deaf Social Network that she met her future husband, John D. McAlister. They married on February 4, 1951 and eventually moved to New York City. Elizabeth and John were blessed with three daughters. The family attended Saint Mark's Lutheran Church for the Deaf and Convent Avenue Baptist Church.

Her working career in the garment industry lasted for over forty years. She was a member of the International Ladies Garment Workers Union. Upon retirement she and John moved to Philadelphia and finally bought their first house. While living there, they joined the "Society for the Helping Church". They both missed New York City so they moved back in 1990. Upon their return Elizabeth and John joined Canaan Baptist Church.

Elizabeth enjoyed traveling, playing bingo, and playing the penny slot machines!! Her favorite television shows were Let's Make A Deal, The Price is Right and Steve Harvey's Family Feud. She "loved", "loved", "loved" sweet potatoes and could eat one everyday.

She was also an active member of the deaf club at National Action Network / House of Justice.

Elizabeth was preceded in death by her parents, her husband, John D. McAlister, three brothers, Israel, William and Ivory McDuffie, and sister, Jessie Ann Plaire.

Those left to cherish her memory are: her loving daughters, Henrietta (Gomez), Joan McAlister and Deanna McAlister; son-in-law, Dennis Gomez; her sister, Edith Branham; her grandchildren, Camille, KeVaughn, Mark, Brian, Shanay, Latia, Diane and Pamela; fourteen great grandchildren; nephews and nieces; and a host of cousins and friends.
