Missionary Etta Mae Ingram was born on January 22, 1924 in Roselle, New Jersey, daughter of the late Mamie Etta Bauknight Culbreath and John W. Culbreath. Etta was a lifelong resident of Cranford where she was educated in the Cranford Public School system and graduated from Cranford High School.

Etta was employed as an Accounting Clerk at New Jersey Bell Telephone Company, retiring in December 30, 1988. Reluctant to leave the workforce, she worked with special needs children as a Teacher Aide at Cranford Public School system for a few years. Etta eventually stopped working in December of 2015. Previously, she was employed at Lerner Plastics in Garwood, New Jersey.

A member of St. Marks A.M.E. Church, she served faithfully on the Missionary Board, Usher Board and member of the Inspirational Choir. Some of her life pleasures was bowling. Etta would play in tournaments with her outstanding bowling partner, her daughter Patricia. She enjoyed watching the amazing New York Mets on television and attending other ball games. Going to Atlantic City was always enjoyable, especially when she met the former Mets Right Fielder, Darryl Strawberry.
