Reflections of Life

Mother Lillie M. Sconiers, the 11th of 12 children, was born July 13, 1940 to the late Albert and Lillie Roberson.

Lillie received her high school diploma in 1959 from South Side High School, Newark, NJ. She then furthered her education at Essex County College where she successfully completed two years of nursing courses.

Lillie married the love of her life, Ray J. Sconiers on July 23, 1962. From this God-given matrimony, three loving children were born; Glinda Lanee, Ramona Joyce, and Reginald Deon. Together they raised their children in the Beauty of Holiness.

Lillie's love for God and the well-being of all mankind afforded her the opportunity to work in United Hospital for twenty-four years in the Hematology and Oncology unit. She later received her CNA certification.

Lillie, at the age of seven, became a member of Holy Temple C.O.G.I.C. (Smith Memorial C.O.G.I.C.) where she loved serving and worshiping the Lord. Lillie was active in the Sunshine Band, the Rosebuds, Usher's Board, and Young People's Choir. While Lillie and her husband, Ray Jr. were president of The Children's Day Choir, Lillie wrote the song and sang throughout the years, "This Is Children's Day". She also dedicated her service on the Deaconess Board, H.S. Chorus, Prison Ministry and formerly served as the president of the Young Women's Christian Council. She was a singer in her brother Ralph's group and was asked to sing solos in her church and the radio station.

Lillie and her husband Ray Jr., upon arriving to Florida, joined Kissimmee C.O.G.I.C. under Pastor Brown. In 2001, they joined Lighthouse C.O.G.I.C. under the leadership of Bishop Jimmy Williams. After the passing of Deacon Ray Jr., Lillie then became a member of The Faith Center, Lauderhill, FL under Bishop Henry Fernandez.

Lillie was an advocate for the education of children. She dedicated her time as a Foster grandparent tutoring at Banyan Elementary School, Sunrise, FL.

Lillie, besides singing and many other talents, loved to bake and would not hesitate to tell everyone how much she loved the Lord.

Lillie was predeceased by three brothers, Albert Roberson, Ralph Roberson, and Joel Roberson, three sisters, Ellen Roberson Wilson, Emma Roberson Outerbridge and Bertha Roberson Jackson.

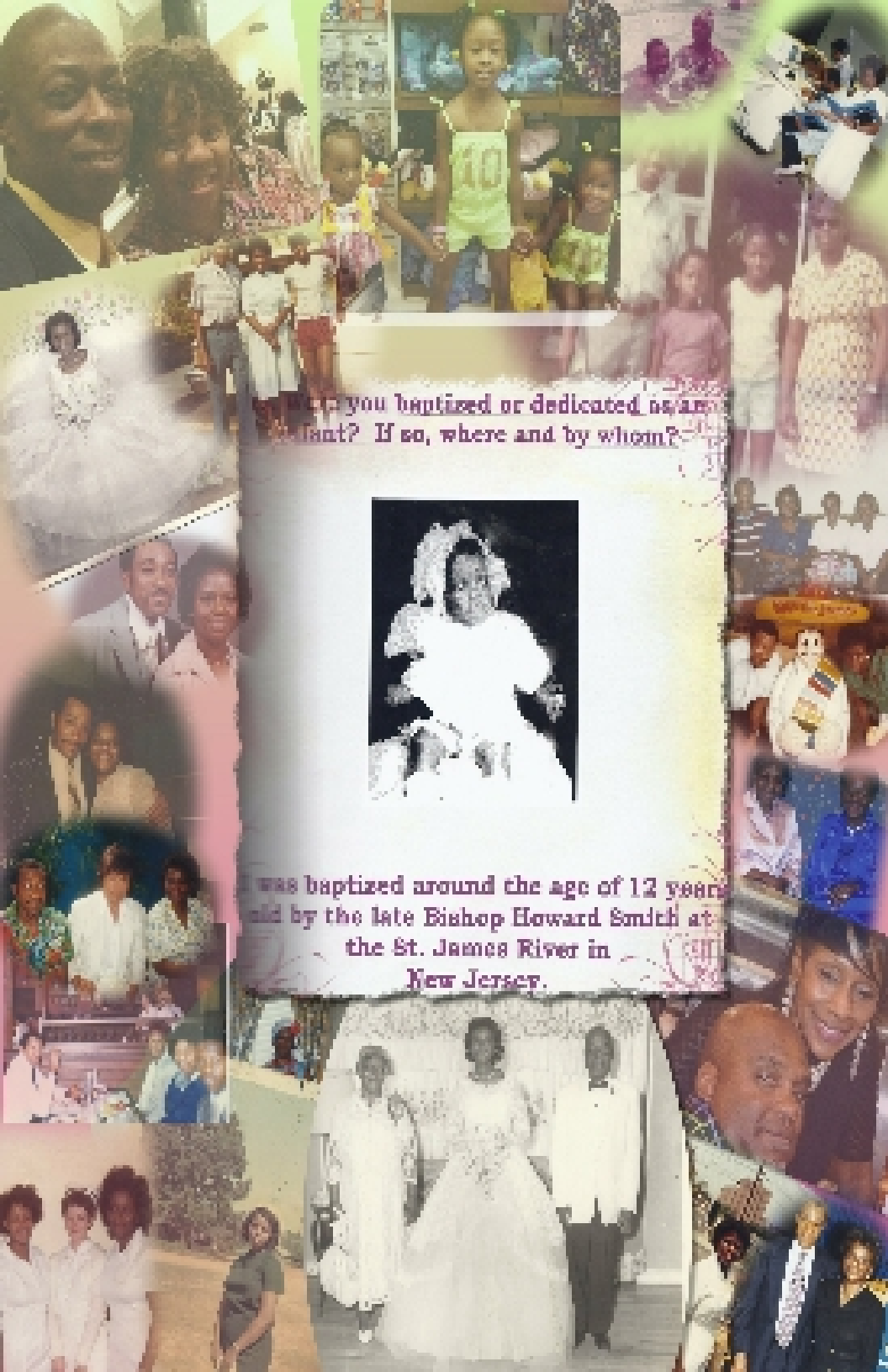

I'm right here in your heart.

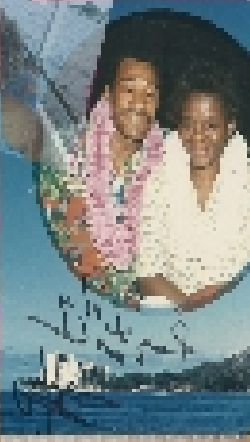
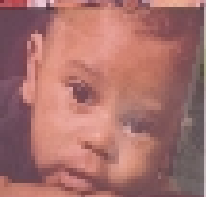


Were you baptized or dedicated as an infant? If so, where and by whom?



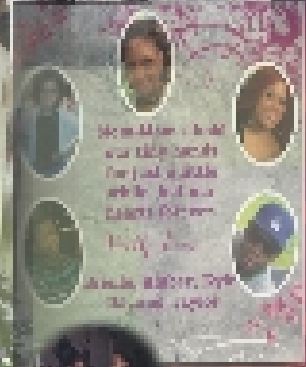
I was baptized around the age of 12 years old by the late Bishop Howard Smith at the St. James River in New Jersey.
