Obituary

Willie Albert Atmore Liverman, of Princeton, NJ passed into eternal rest on Tuesday, July 5, 2016. He was born October 7, 1944 in Columbia, North Carolina.

Called “Albert” by many, he was affectionately known as “Puggie” by his childhood family and friends. He was a 1962 graduate of Central High School in Gates, North Carolina, and was employed by the school system as a bus driver at the age of sixteen. In 1965, he was drafted into the United States Army where he faithfully served his country during the Vietnam Conflict as a Paratrooper in the 173rd Airborne Division. He attended Lincoln Technical Institute and received his certification in Heating, Ventilation and Air Conditioning/Refrigeration. He continued his education at Syracuse University Hydraulics Institute, where he received his Black Seal License.

He worked for many years for Princeton Heating and Oil, Trenton State Prison and the Educational Testing Service. After retirement, he continued to be self-employed. Albert was considered a “Jack of All Trades” who often used his crafts to help his church and many in the community. He was a New York Yankees fan and a huge Dallas Cowboys fan. He joined Mt. Pisgah AME Church, Princeton, where he was part of the men’s ministry.

Albert was predeceased by his parents, Eddie Mckinley Liverman, Sr. and Sarah Frances Elizabeth Sykes Liverman; siblings, Eddie M. Liverman, Jr., Sarah Harrell, Malvina Liverman and Betty Parker; brothers-in-law, Leo Farrow, Lorenzo Eure, Early White, Percy Bond, George Holmes, Larry Madden, and John Madden; and sister-in-law, Helen King.
