Roselyne Tyner was a native New Yorker. She graduated from Seward Park High School, New York City. She received her Bachelor of Arts and Social Work at the age of 73 from the College of New Rochelle, New York City. After 25 years of service, Roselyne retired in 1991 from the Department of Human Services as a Principal Administrator.

Rose was an active member of the Immaculate Conception Roman Catholic Church of the South Bronx. In 1998, she was instrumental in organizing the first gospel concert and in 1999, the first and only revival in the church. Father Francis S. Kelly, Pastor in the "The Catholic New York" newspaper stated that Rose Tyner was the driving force behind the concert and the revival. Rose was also a member of the Concourse Village Special Adults Choir. She was the entertainment coordinator for group. Rose was the leader of the inspirational group that entertained once a month at the Greater Harlem Nursing Home.

In 1991, Rose volunteered to be a "Grandma" for the kindergarten children at the St. Augustine School. For the past eight years, she was a volunteer for the RSVP at P.S. 150 in the Bronx where she tutored first and second graders in reading.

And 1992, Rose was a contestant in a beauty contest called "Golden Image Awards." She did not become queen, but she realized she did not need to win to be a queen. She felt like a queen just being a part of that beautiful event. Since then, she has been one of the recruiters for women 60 years and up for participation in this event.

Rose was a proud parent of two children. Her son Lawrence is an entrepreneur in Nashville, Tennessee and her daughter, Deborah is a schoolteacher in Dover, Delaware. She was also the proud grandmother of Genese and great grandmother of Shaniece, Janiaya, Justin and Aajahneye.

Throughout her life, Rose has received many awards including an appreciation award in 2002 from Mayor Michael Bloomberg. Her interests and hobbies were making people laugh, working with children, singing, dancing, acting, modeling and traveling. She also enjoyed caring for both the young and the old and according to her friends she was a joy to everyone she met. She was a DIVA and enjoyed her life to the fullest.
