To this union two sons were born, Leroy "BO" Freeman Jr. and Richard "Deon" Freeman. What a joyful family of seven as Leroy and Effie enjoyed cooking for the family as their specialty were fried whiting fish, turkey wings and oxtails. She instilled the value of family in her home and she cooked every day after work for the family, often her nephews, Ellis (Lil'Red) & James (Duke) dined together with their Aunt Effie and Uncle Freeman. Effie was a devoted mother and wanted to earn more to ensure that the children were provided advanced opportunities, she sought employment in the industrial field and later child Care, retiring from Rutgers School of Day Care for Children.
