At a young age, her mom passed away and she was raised by her sisters.

Around 1939, Sadie married Roddie Adolphus and moved to Rockstone Pond where their union created two beautiful daughters, Louise Emelia and Joan Marie. She raised her girls on their farm with lots of animals and a strong belief in education. When her girls were young, she used to entertain them by sharing comical stories of her past and making them handmade dolls to play with.

Sadie had a strong willed, firm personality and anyone who was blessed to be in her presence knew this. "Ms. Sadie noh eezi – shee noh run joak!" was one of the statements that reflected her true essence. She was also a very trustworthy, business-minded woman, who believed in saving money and who managed her farm, her rental property and her children in a manner which made her family very proud. Her strong belief in the value of education was passed onto her daughters, who both became teachers. Even at 94, Sadie remained an avid reader, able to read her Bible and holiday cards, independently, until the day of her death.

Sadie is preceded in death by her husband of fifty-four years, Roddie Adolphus and all but two of her siblings, Joe and Bill Flowers. She leaves behind: her two loving daughters, Louise (Abraham) and Joan (Sydney); her "son", Dickie Flowers; six grandchildren, Carla, Dawn (Steve), Stuart (Tina), Abraham, Jr. (Kristi), Sherette (Robert) and Denise; six great-grandchildren, Stuart, Aminah, Isabel, Anisa, Robert and Saniyah; and a host of other family and friends.
