William Thomas Lawrence Jr. was born on January 26, 1961 to the late Mary Hughes and William Thomas Lawrence Sr. in Manhattan New York. William was the second oldest child and the oldest of five boys. All of his

siblings and relatives loved him dearly because of his bright smile, sense of humor, and his ability to cook.

William was affectionately known as "Brutee or Bill". His family relocated to Paterson New Jersey during the fall of 1969. William attended Paterson Public School #6 and Martin Luther King Jr. Upon graduating from the eighth grade, William went on to Eastside High School, the home of the "The Mighty Ghosts." During his years at Eastside High School he became a member of the Eastside High School Marching Band 100, where he played the tuba extremely well under the great leadership of William Pete Nelson.
