Breya Necole Knight was born October 2nd, 1986 in Orange, New Jersey to Dyanna and the late Joseph Warren Knight.

Breya strongly believed that God was faithful, that he could do the unthinkable. At the tender age of 10, Breya accepted Christ and was baptized at Tabernacle Baptist Church in Newark, N.J. under the leadership of Pastor Jeffrey Bryan.

Breya was born and destined to be an ARTIST. Even at a young age, Breya showed and expressed her love for art, and music, nature and poetry which she loved to teach others whether they were young or old. Breya loved children and was appointed to be the youth leader at her church. Breya always had a strong sense of leadership, personality and spirituality with a different perspective. One of her favorite scriptures was Revelations 22:17 "And the Spirit and bride say, "Come!" And let him who hears say, "Come!" And let him who thirsts come. Whoever desires, let him take the water of life freely." This scripture became her way of life by welcoming everyone she came into contact with and allowing them to just be themselves.

Breya attended Weequahic High School in Newark, New Jersey and later transferred to Newark Vocational High School where she became an Alumni. During her educational journey, her love for art grew which sparked an interest in play productions, songwriting, book writing, poetry, and so much more. She also attended Essex County College where she majored in Graphic Arts and Communications. While perfecting her craft in the Arts, Breya joined the Cut Creator's family in 2005 until her death. Her style of fashion and hair was on a whole other level - it was unique, bold, expressive and it fit just for her. Breya also became an employee of the Newark Public School systems for six years which paved more ways to mentor children she called her own.

Breya was and will live on forever as a Newark activist. From poetry cyphers, sweater drives to feeding the homeless, her life shined on all who crossed her path. Breya's consistent words of encouragement healed and motivated her community. The platform she was given to display her talents were endless and a testament to how talented she truly

became. Many opportunities were given to display her gifts such as 24-hours of peace, Lincoln Park Music Festival, McDonald's Gospel Fest, Symphony Hall, NJPAC, and Sharing the stage with countless celebrities while creating great professional relationships made her a household name. Understanding and accepting her position as a Creator, Motivator, PoeticDiabetic, HipAsHop, HumanJukebox, NeGROWspiritual leader for change she was a woman who stood for equality, triumph, love, and ambition. Her drive was infectious. She became an independent, owner operator at All Knight Artistry. Her stylish ways drove her to create Knightmare & Sweet Dreams T-Shirt Factory, her passion for spoken word left no choice, but to be the Founder and CEO and Owner of The Breathing Poets Society.

After physically suffering from complications with diabetes, she still pushed and poetically released her spirits to her community as she made her transition from Earthly home and walked smoothly through to heavens gates on August 14th, 2016.
