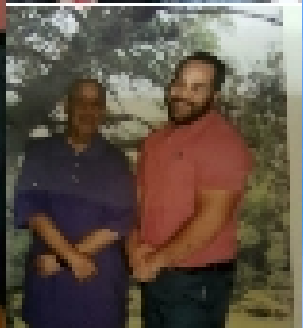
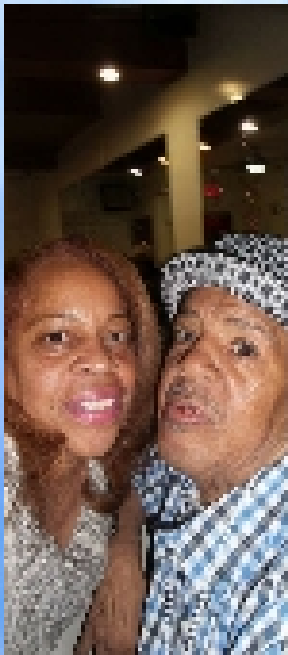
His greatest love was the love he gave to his very large family.
