Ruth Barbee was born December 25, 1927, in Birmingham, Alabama to parents Marion Stoudemire and Julia Henderson Moore.

While a young enthusiastic teenager, Barbee arrived in Cincinnati, Ohio with her mother and resided there for two and a half years before settling in New York as a Harlem resident. She pursued a career as a licensed beautician graduating from APEX Academy School of Cosmetology and working at Hilda Guards Beauty Salon which was in lower Manhattan.

Barbee enjoyed spending time with her children and grandchildren and playing with her pets. She also was known to be a "fashionista" while she drove her red Camaro and green Mustang and listened to R&B groups such as the Stylistics and Earth Wind and Fire and R&B artists such as Stevie Wonder and Marvin Gaye. She was quite the poker champion at many tournaments. Atlantic City was one of her favorite places to go and show such skills. Cooking, especially baking, was another skill that she had that so many family and friends treasured.

In 1971, Barbee married her mate of many years, James Barbee, and later went to work as a private duty healthcare nurse at Lenox Hill Hospital in Manhattan before she took ill. Barbee's health gradually waned prompting her retirement.

Barbee is survived by: her husband, James Barbee; her daughter, Shirley (Earl) Williams of New Jersey; her son, Jerome (Three) Davis of New Jersey; her son, Larry (Denise) Davis of Ohio; thirteen grandchildren; ten great grandchildren; her sister, Helen of Alabama; and nephews, Johnny of Minnesota and Larue of New York. She was preceded in death by her son, Ronnie Davis; her brother, George; and sisters, Lillian, Della, and Wanda.
