

The words of the Psalmist, highlighted in his bible, belonged, as well, to **Joseph Tyrone White**, born the fourth child to the late James Edward and Callie Mae (Knox) White on July 19, 1949 in Birmingham, Alabama, who entered into his eternal rest on September 3, 2016 in Passaic, New Jersey.

Joe, as he was affectionately known, attended school in Birmingham, Alabama until he relocated to Passaic, New Jersey along with his family, graduating from Passaic Senior High School in 1967. While in school, Joe excelled in Basketball and Football, honored as a letterman with P.V.C. and All-County Honors.

At an early age he accepted Christ as his personal savior, was baptized, and became a member of the St. Paul Baptist Church in Passaic, New Jersey, under the leadership of the late Rev. Lucius Walker.

Upon graduating high school, Joe married his Queen; his sweetheart of his school years, Barbara Jean King. To this special union four children were born: Joseph R., Twins, Tim and Kim and Rakema L. During the early years of his adult life, Joe succumbed to the difficult challenges of the times and suffered the consequences felt by so many of us as a people of despair. He became a member of the Calvary Baptist Church of North Jersey at Garfield under the leadership of his brother-in-law, the Rev. Dr. Calvin McKinney who he affectionately described as "His Pastor." Joe was employed at Robert Mfg. Company, Saddle Brook, New Jersey for a number of years and later as a Supervisor by Imperia Packaging Company for twentyfive years until his illness.

A loving family man to his siblings, and most proudly to his wife, children and grandchildren, he was loved and appreciated in a unique way by all in the community, and especially in the Barbershop.

He was predeceased by his parents and eldest brother, James Henry.
