Obituary

He was a farmer just like most of the men of his generation were. But men with his work ethics, his character, his dedication to his family, his place, and so his community are rare today. He had a deep connection to his farm. His farm was a lot more to him than a piece of land to make money. He was always looking for ways to improve his farm.

At a very young age, Lifaite was taught along with his brothers and sister to value and respect where both things and people come from. That everything and everyone has a place and purpose in this world. Lifaite was a caretaker and a steward. He was a problem solver. He was fair and honest in dealing with others. He was always willing to help anyone who was in need of assistance. He had a great sense of humor and laughed easily. Perhaps the hardest thing about old age for Lifaite was the loss of his ability to work. Lifaite defined himself by his work ethics. He did a lot of physical labor in his time and was a physically powerful man, well into his seventies and eighties. He lived a long life, a full life, strong and clean life. Lifaite would challenge you to think of a better one what he has been called to do in his life time, he has done it. Lifaite Gabriel has fulfilled his duties as a son, a brother, a husband, a father, a grandfather, a great grandfather, and as a friend and neighbor. He has fulfilled his moral obligations to the land, to his farm, to his animals that he has cared for and worked to his family and to his community. It is now left to the rest of us to live up to his example.

It was with deep and heavy sadness that we announced the death of Lifaite Gabriel, who passed away on September 1, 2016 at Mount Sinai Hospital in New York after several months of increasing debility and discomfort with Alzheimer.
