

Reflections of Life for <u>Tomasa Alfonso</u>

Tomasa "Cuca" Alfonso was born on March 7, 1935, in Havana, Cuba. She was one of eight children born to the late Fernando Calzada and Maria Rivero Calzada.

In 1969, while still in Cuba, she married Augusto Alfonso. From this union she had one beloved son, Jose. In 1970, she and her family migrated from Cuba to start a new life in the United States. After a brief stay in Minnesota with extended family, Bushwick, Brooklyn became her home where see would raise her family and establish relationships that would last a lifetime.

To support her family, Tomasa took a job as a highly skilled seamstress at a clothing factory in Downtown Manhattan. Dedicating herself to do everything for her son, she took classes at Our Lady of Lourdes and learned to speak English. She genuinely embraced everyone who had the privilege of knowing her. She treated her neighbors and friends as sisters and brothers. Above all, and always closest to her heart, the sun rose and set on her son, Jose.

In 1987, she joined the Brooklyn Central Laundry at Kings County Hospital as a laundress. It was at the Central Laundry where she made even more friends that, in typical "Tomasa style," became family. She was a devoted mother and wife who loved to be around people. She loved to host elegant social gatherings as well as informal get-togethers for any occasion, or no occasion at all. As many of Jose's college friends can attest to, she was a phenomenal cook – her USPS-delivered care packages of cooked pernil, rice and beans, macaroni and cheese and so much more saved many a hungry college student following the aromatic mail Jose regularly carried from the mail room. Tomasa was always willing and ready to help others and willing to do anything for anyone in need, just because. In a word, she was an angel on Earth among us and is now our guardian angel watching over us. There is no doubt that she is in Heaven orchestrating and preparing a feast for everyone around her to enjoy in celebration of her arrival.

In 1994, after twenty-five years of marriage, Tomasa became a widow and a single mother, but never surrendered her joy for life – a philosophy she embraced until the very end. In 2004, she married Clyde Gale who, along with her son, was devoted to her and cared for her.

On September 21, 2016, while at the Brooklyn Queens Nursing Home, Brooklyn, New York, at the age of eighty-one, Tomasa was called Home by our Heavenly Father after a valiant battle with many illnesses. Her transition to eternal life was peaceful and without suffering. She is predeceased by both of her parents. Her siblings in Cuba, both alive and in spirit with her now are her brothers, Valentín Calzada, Narciso Senobio Calzada, Gregorio Calzada, Domingo Calzada, and her sisters, Manuela Calzada, Juana Calzada, and Cecilia Borroto.
