<u>Obituary</u>

Berman Oliver Saunders, MD (Bertie), was born on May 10th 1940, in Kitty, Georgetown Guyana. Bertie was the youngest of seven children born to Isabella Eldica Saunders (Ivy) and Henry Archer Saunders. He was the brother of Kora Roberts (deceased), Alphonso Saunders (deceased), Beryl O'John (UK), Daphne Bartholomew (Trinidad), Shirley McPherson (Guyana), Winston Saunders (FL, USA).

Bertie began his formal education at the Kitty Methodist Primary, then Tutorial High School. He eventually traveled to Scotland then England, and finally the United States of America (US) where he took up residence.

At the tender age of six years old, he vowed to become a doctor after witnessing a mother's grief from the death of her son, because she was unable to pay for his medical expenses. This thought of caring for the poor and other undeserved persons was the driving force as he pursued his studies.

He attended Rutgers Newark College of Art and Science, then The University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey (UMDNJ), where he obtained his Medical Degree. He completed his Residency in Family Practice at Mountainside Hospital, Montclair, New Jersey.

Bertie received many awards, academic and humanitarian. He was a member of Phi Beta Kappa Psi Chi, the National Honor Society of Psychologists. While he was a sophomore, he was elected to the position of Director of the Student Family Health Center at UMDNJ, a position usually reserved for seniors. The center provided after hours care for the uninsured and indigent in the Newark community.

During that time, he received the coveted Foster Burnett, MD student award for Community Service Development, and more recent, the Community Service Award for Outstanding

Medical Out-Reach Work in the USA and Caribbean, from the Caribbean American Medical and Scientific Association, Inc. Multiple additional awards have since followed.

He excelled in the medical field having joined East Orange General Hospital Family Health Center while maintaining a private practice located in West Orange, New Jersey. He was instrumental in acquiring a Mobile Health Clinic under the sponsorship of the East Orange General Hospital, to provide on the spot care for patients who could not access a health care facility.

He was true son of Guyana, and never forgot his home and the promise he had made. In 1979, he began traveling annually to Guyana and several other countries including Jamaica to voluntarily offer his expertise. In 2000 in collaboration with OSHAG, he joined a team of doctors and nurses who traveled to Guyana to provide medical assistance to various regions, in addition to instructions in health care, a practice he continued doing annually.

If you knew him, you knew that he believed in giving back to the community, he LOVED TO PARTY and his friends were most important to him. He enjoyed soccer, cricket and playing dominoes.


